Have you noticed recently the birds are back singing. It signals the advent of spring. Based on the weather you would think they would not be nesting yet but they are looking at prospective locations. If you have any nesting boxes, see if they have any old nests in them or debris, any such material should be removed.

We should continue to feed them as there is very little available to them in the wild. Fat balls and peanuts are good. I find that if I put the mixed seeds into the feeder the birds are a bit sloppy and drop some seeds which results in a visit from rodents within a few hours.

If you feed birds expect a visit from birds of prey like a Sparrow Hawk or Buzzards. I have a very cheeky Buzzard at the moment who does not move if I get near him. Of course these boys are after the small birds. Why not put up a nest box or two. I put up a ball with a hole in it and a wren made a nest. Surprising but truly amazing!
