Monday 9th:-**The Church of St John on the Lateran in Rome** is "Mother and Head of all the churches of all the City and the World." It is the Cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome, and was called "St. John" after the two monasteries once attached, dedicated to St John the Divine and St John the Baptist. It is however dedicated to The Most Holy Saviour. Tuesday 10th:- **Leo the Great** St, d, 461 taught the two natures of Christ at the Council of Chalcedon, 451, and the Primacy of the Sea of Peter.

Wednesday 11th:-**St Martin of Tours** 335-'97 Bishop of Tours apostle of rural Gaul, founder of monasteries. Patron of France, soldiers, beggars and inn-keepers.

Thursday 12th:- **St Josaphat** 1580-1623, Bishop of Polotz, worked for reunion of Ukranion Catholics:- but his murder by those who opposed it brought about many conversion Saturday 14th **St Laurence O'Toole** became a monk and abbot of Glendalough. He was made Archbishop of Dublin in 1162. He returned to Ireland after the Third Lateran Council as Papal Legate in 1179. He died at Eu in Normandy seeking to make peace between Henry 11 and the Irish rulers in 1180.
