CALENDAR:-

Tuesday 11th **St Benedict**, 480-547, after living as a hermit at Subiaco he founded the monastery of Moate Cassino. His rule observed by Benedictines and Cistercians is distinguished by its wisdom and balance and those who live by it did much to shape the Europe of today. He was named patron of Europe in 1964.

Thursday 13th **St Henry** (973-1024). He was Duke of Bavaria and later Emperor, a just ruler, humble man of prayer and reformer of the Church.

Friday 14th**St Camillus de Lellis**, 1550-1614, rough-tempered and gambler in his early life as a soldier and converted at the age of 25. Guided by Philip Neri he became a priest and worked for the sick with two companions. His Servants of the Sick prospered and founded hospitals where others would not go. Patron of nurses, hospitals and the sick.

Saturday 15th **St Bonaventure**, 1221-1274, born in Tuscany, Minister General of the Franciscans, Cardinal Archbishop of Albano, theologian of the Council of Lyons.
