CALENDAR

Tuesday 27th:-**St Ascus** was St Patrick's expert craftsman in metal work and accompanied him on his journeys. He was left in charge of the Church in Elphin which Patrick is said to have founded.

Wednesday 28th:- **St Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort** 1673-1716, was a priest whose calling was to preach missions. More important was the spirit of prayer which he instilled especially with the recitation of the Rosary.

Thursday 29th:- **St. Catherine of Siena** 1347-'80 humble and dauntless Dominican tertiary, who brought peace to her native Siena, to Italy and to fourteenth-century Europe. She spent all her energies on the Church being able to achieve the Pope's return from Avignon to Rome. She is remembered also as 1970 and patron of Europe in 2000.

Friday 30th:-**St Pius V** 1504-'72 Dominican, elected Pope in 1565, he implemented the reforms of the Council of Trent, including the Breviary, Missal and Catechism. He is noticed for his defence of Christendom against the Ottoman Empire.
